### SPOTLIGHT // VALUES

In Acts 20, Paul says to the Ephesian elders, "Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God". The word for care is related to our word shepherd. Shepherding is the biblical imagery for the kind of care that the Lord gives us in Christ, the Chief Shepherd, and that he intends for all of his people to experience in the local church.

Our hope at Signal Pres is that every member would be shepherded, known, and cared for in an intentional and personal way. While this care is not the exclusive responsibility of the elders, it does begin there. That is why we have taken steps to ensure that every household in our church is known by an elder of the church. As of last month, each elder has a fold of 12-20 households and over the rest of the year the elder will be ensuring that he/she at least begins to know each of them. Your elder will be reaching out to you over the weeks or months ahead to start getting to know you. You certainly are free to reach out to your elder before then!

Generally, we like to be seen but not known. But the wonder of the gospel is that in Christ we are fully known and fully loved, and that the local church really can be a place where both things are true. That's our goal. So when you hear from your elder, resist the urge to brush this opportunity off as we move together towards being a community where no one is alone.
